Ye did me no wrong: but ye know that because of an infirmity of the flesh I preached the gospel unto you the first time: and that which was a temptation to you in my flesh ye despised not, nor rejected; but ye received me as an angel of God, *even* as Christ Jesus." - "For I am the least of the apostles, that am not meet to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am: and his grace which was bestowed upon me was not found vain; but I labored more abundantly than they all: yet not I, but the grace of God which was with me." 1 Corinthians 15:9-10

Paul's Thorn In the Flesh

Paul's reaction...prayed that it might be taken away

Concerning this thing I besought the Lord thrice, that it might depart from me." 2 Corinthians 12:8

Natural reaction... wanted to be rid of it

Prayed three times that it might be removed

Paul's reaction

ℽ Prayer answered …but not as requested

Paul's Thorn In the Flesh

Paul's acceptance of God's answer... for when I am weak, then am I strong

"Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: **for when I am weak**, **then am I strong**." **2 Corinthians 12:10**

Paul's Thorn In the Flesh

Paul's acceptance of God's answer...I have learned to be content

"Not that I speak in respect of want: for I have learned, in whatsoever state I am, therein to be content. I know how to be abased, and I know also how to abound: in everything and in all things have I learned the secret both to be filled and to be hungry, both to abound and to be in want. I can do all things in him that strengtheneth me." Philippians 4:11-13

Paul's Thorn In the Flesh Paul's acceptance of God's answer... unlike Jonah when things didn't go like he wanted

"But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he was angry. And he prayed unto Jehovah, and said, I pray thee, O Jehovah, was not this my saying, when I was yet in my country? Therefore I hasted to flee unto Tarshish; for I knew that thou art a gracious God, and merciful, slow to anger, and abundant in lovingkindness, and repentest thee of the evil." Jonah 4:1-4

Paul's acceptance of God's answer... unlike Jonah when things didn't go like he wanted

"Therefore now, O Jehovah, take, I beseech thee, my life from me; for it is better for me to die than to live. And Jehovah said, Doest thou well to be angry?" Jonah 4:1-4

Paul's Thorn In the Flesh

Paul's acceptance of God's answer... unlike Asaph who struggled with acceptance of his position in life

"Surely God is good to Israel, *Even* to such as are pure in heart. **But as for me, my feet were** almost gone; My steps had well nigh slipped. For I was envious at the arrogant, When I saw the prosperity of the wicked." Psalm 73:1-3

Paul's Thorn In the Flesh

Our thorns in life can strengthen our faith and bring us honor when Christ returns

"Wherein ye greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, ye have been put to grief in manifold trials, that the proof of your faith, *being* more precious than gold that perisheth though it is proved by fire, may be found unto praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ:" (continued) 1 Peter 1:6-9

Paul's Thorn In the Flesh

Our thorns in life can strengthen our faith and bring us honor when Christ returns

"whom not having seen ye love; on whom, though now ye see him not, yet believing, ye rejoice greatly with joy unspeakable and full of glory: receiving the end of your faith, *even* the salvation of *your* souls." **1 Peter 1:6-9**
